Explore Moorea's visual splendor, art and local Polynesian lifestyle during this scenic orientation drive around the island.

Depart the pier for a scenic and relaxing drive around Moorea. The distance around this idyllic island is approximately 38 miles, and offers many spectacular sites and photo opportunities. You will ride past pineapple fields and visit an ancient Tahitian stone temple, or marae, en route to Belvedere. You will also take in magnificent views of Cook's Bay, Opunohu Bay and Mt. Rotui. As you pass through the districts of Haapiti, you will see one of the island's loveliest churches before continuing through Afareitu and Papetoai.

Next, you will explore the island's artistic beauty during a stop at an art gallery in the Tiki Village. Here, you will have an opportunity to visit a replica of Gauguin's Maison du Jouir and view a large selection of the most beautiful reproductions of his artwork.

Your tour will conclude with a visit to a village featuring a black-and-white picture gallery showcasing the works of famous photographer A. Sylvain. Located by the ocean, the village is home to a lovely white-sand beach that offers wonderful photo opportunities. Restrooms and a small boutique are also available here. Following your visit, you will rejoin your coach for the return drive to the pier.

Join marine biologist Dr. Michael Poole, a French-Polynesian dolphin specialist since 1987, or his assistant for this combination eco-tour and research expedition focusing on wild, free-ranging dolphins.

Depart the pier aboard a covered boat for the scenic ride to Moorea's reef. Spinner dolphins, the slightly larger rough-tooth dolphins and pilot whales can be seen around Moorea, with spinner dolphins regularly swimming inside the reef. With a little luck, you will see schools of acrobatic spinner dolphins while listening to informative commentary about their remarkable life and society at sea.

During your tour, you will also learn about French Polynesia's geology and evolution while viewing Moorea's dramatic beauty from the sea. Dolphins are found on 95% of the tours, but the engaging narrative and sheer magnificence of Moorea's coastline will ensure a rewarding time. Guests visiting between July and early November may also have an opportunity to view the humpback whales perform their annual mating and calving rituals.

Following your tour, you will have an opportunity to go swimming or snorkeling directly from the boat (time permitting) before being transferred back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves a water entry; not a swim with the dolphins. While this tour can accommodate those with mobility concerns, due to limitations with the transportation used on the tour, wheelchairs and walkers must remain on the pier with security. There are no restrooms or changing facilities on board the boat. Wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses and a towel from the ship. Operation of this tour is subject to guide availability.

If you love photography, then don't miss this unique and exclusive half-day guided tour of Moorea with an experience photographer. Although it is not an Advanced Professional Workshop, beginners & experienced photographers alike will appreciate the technical recommendations shared during the tour.

Depart the pier aboard a private, 4WD vehicle for a guided photo tour of Moorea. Your guide will offer photographic tips and interesting information about the island throughout the tour. Drive to the interior of the island along large pineapple fields, and past sub-tropical forests dotted with ancient archeological sites. En route, a stop will be made at Belvedere's lookout point for spectacular views and photo opportunities of Rotui, a beautiful mountain separating Cook's Bay and the pristine Opunohu Bay.

Drive along the coastal road to the island's west coast, where you will take in expansive views of lush green vegetation, beautifully manicured gardens, a turquoise blue lagoon and the Pacific Ocean's endless horizon.

Weather permitting, you will see sites that include the famed Magic Mountain, which overlooks the northern part of the island and offers spectacular aerial views of the barrier reef. The highlight of this photo adventure tour will include visits to off-road locations in the island's interior. Additional sites to be seen include the Papetoai fishing village.

Please note: This tour may be offered with 2 vehicles sharing one guide and will be adapted to the weather forecast and light of the day. While there is limited walking on the tour, it does involve travel over bumpy surfaces and tour is not recommended for guests with back and/or neck problems, limited mobility or pregnant women. Comfortable clothing; sun cap; sunglasses; sunscreen; insect repellent; a bottle of water from the ship and flat shoes with a non-slip sole are recommended. Depart the pier via four-wheel-drive vehicle for the scenic drive through Moorea's deep valleys and mountains. Your adventure begins with a drive to Paopao Valley. After passing by some pineapple plantations, you will cross the Paopao Opunohu Trail en route to Opunohu. A stop will then be made at one of the numerous sacred ancient sites, or marae, where you will learn about Polynesian culture.

Next, you will continue to the Belvédère Lookout for incredible panoramic views overlooking Cook's and Opunohu bays. From here, you will drive through the interior trails of the Agricultural School of Moorea to see the local flora. Moorea, known as the Green Garden of Polynesia, is renowned for its school, which receives children from all the outer islands. A stop will be made here to use the restrooms and sample some homemade jam. Ice cream and local fruit juices will also be available for purchase.

Following your visit, you will commence the steep ascent up Magic Mountain. Here, a little path lined by grapefruit, lemon and orange trees opens up to a panoramic vista stretching across Opunohu Bay, the lagoon and the sea. Your tour will conclude with a stop at the Fruit Juice Factory of Moorea to sample their liquors.

Please note: The Agricultural School of Moorea and Fruit Juice Factory will be closed on Saturday afternoon and Sundays; on those days, the tour will be reduced in duration. Guests must be at least 21 years of age to participate in tastings of alcoholic beverages.

Experience the beauty of Cook's and Opunohu bays from above and below sea level during this snorkeling and beach adventure aboard a modern covered boat.

Depart the pier aboard a comfortable and modern boat featuring covered areas designed to protect you from the direct rays of the sun. As you cruise along these majestic bays, your captain will inform you about the legends, geography, flora and fauna of Moorea.

Next, you will continue on to a gorgeous sandy islet surrounded by transparent turquoise waters that are shallow enough to walk comfortably in the sea. Upon arrival, you will have a rare opportunity to feed the awaiting rays; they will gracefully glide around you in exchange for a piece of fish.

Your tour will conclude with a stop at another uninhabited islet nearby. Here, you will be served refreshments, and have an opportunity to explore the beach and swim. You will also be invited to go snorkeling in water 6-10 feet deep. Snorkeling is performed in the shallow waters off the boat, providing an excellent opportunity for beginner and experienced snorkelers. The boat's ladders extend deep into the water, making it easy to embark and disembark the craft.

Following your visit, you will be transferred back to the pier.

Please note: This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition who are good swimmers. Guests must be comfortable wearing the snorkeling equipment provided (mask and snorkel), being in deep water and able to cope with occasional currents. The snorkeling locations selected may vary depending upon lagoon conditions that include sea conditions and visibility. Swimwear worn under a cover-up; sun cap; sunglasses; biodegradable sunscreen; towel; and flat, comfortable shoes or aquasocks are recommended. Guests are cautioned not to touch or step on the coral reef for both safety and environmental reasons. The catamaran offers plenty of casual seating either under a canopy astern, or on the nets located in the bow.

Upon reaching the clear waters of the lagoon, the captain will drop anchor and after receiving a safety briefing receiving a safety briefing, your crew will invite you to a refreshing swim.

After your swim stop, you will set sail back to the pier.

Please note: This tour is recommended for guests in good physical condition who are good swimmers. It is necessary to negotiate a high step to board the vessel. The tour is not recommended to wheelchair guests or those with mobility concerns. Guests must be able to cope with occasional currents. Swimwear worn under a cover-up; sun cap; sunglasses; biodegradable sunscreen; towel; and a bottle of water from the ship are recommended. Shoes must be removed upon boarding the catamaran. Swim with Atlantic bottlenose dolphins in a natural lagoon at an oceanfront resort, an unforgettable experience, as dolphins are exceptionally charismatic, social mammals.

After departing from the pier, you will soon arrive at the Intercontinental Moorea Resort and Spa, a luxurious property tucked between forested mountains and a crystal-clear lagoon. In addition to catering to guests, the resort serves as a sanctuary for marine animals such as sea turtles and Atlantic bottlenose dolphins.

During your orientation, the dolphin trainers will tell you all you've ever wanted to know about Atlantic Bottlenose dolphins: their anatomy, behavior, and habits. Then, equipped with a life vest and mask you will ease into the lagoon's waist-deep water for an up-close encounter with these friendly, curious mammals. Dolphins are great acrobats and water ballet dancers and their impressive jumps and flips are fascinating to observe. Although each encounter will be different, you can expect the dolphins to gently approach, allowing you to touch them and you may also hear them communicating with clicks, squeaks and whistles, a system so complex scientists don't fully understand it.

Following your dolphin encounter, you will have time to shower and change before heading to the Dolphin Boutique where you and enjoy a refreshment and a bit of free time to shop before returning to the pier.

Please note: This tour includes limited walking. The tour is not available to wheelchair guests and not considered suitable for those with mobility concerns as participants must be able to enter and exit the water with limited assistance. A swimsuit; change of clothing; sun cap; sunglasses; a towel from the ship; and reef shoes are recommended. No jewelry may be worn while in the water. Cameras are not allowed in the water; however, a photographer will be on hand taking pictures which you may purchase later. Those who participate in any water activities do so at their own risk and responsibility and should be comfortable in waist-high water. The local operator requires all participants to sign a liability waiver before being allowed to take part in the experience. Please be aware that dolphins remain wild animals and the tour can be canceled according to their behavior and in case of extreme weather conditions.

Cruise through a crystal-clear lagoon just offshore, stopping to snorkel and swim before continuing into the open sea where the views are even more spectacular.

After departing from the pier in a sleek catamaran, you will settle in for a relaxing and immensely scenic cruise through a nearby lagoon. The 65-foot Ohana is the largest and fastest catamaran in its class and Cruise through a crystal-clear lagoon just offshore, stopping to snorkel and swim before continuing into the open sea where the views are even more spectacular.

After departing from the pier in a sleek catamaran, you will settle in for a relaxing and immensely scenic cruise through a nearby lagoon. The 65-foot Ohana is the largest and fastest catamaran in its class and offers plenty of shaded seating under its canopy. For those who prefer to bask in the sun, there is comfortable mesh netting on the bow.

With its shallow draft, the catamaran is ideal for cruising the lagoon and into areas other boats simply can't reach. The waters here are translucent, but for an even closer look at the wonders below, you may snorkel over the coral reefs admiring the colorful tropical fish.

The sights are just as magnificent above the surface, as heart-shaped mountainous Moorea is lined with pristine beaches backed by forests of lush palms. In many ways, the landscape hasn't changed dramatically since Captain James Cook and Captain Samuel Wallis explored here in the 18th century.

In time, you will sail out of the lagoon and into the open sea, where you might spot tiki carved stones on the shore of Moorea. The island's name means "yellow lizard," referring to the legend of a large, yellow lizard that carved out the island's two bays with its tail. As you sail back to the pier, enjoy some refreshments and be sure to keep an eye out for frolicking spinner dolphins.

Please note: This tour includes limited walking; however participants must navigate 2 steps to enter and exit the catamaran. Guests must be physically alert of the boat's environment and fit enough to accommodate the vessel's movement. Shoes must be removed before boarding. Access to the restroom is via a straight ladder. The tour is not available to wheelchair guests and not considered suitable for those with mobility concerns. Swimwear under a cover-up; sun cap; sunglasses; biodegradable sunscreen; a towel and a bottle of water from the ship and flat shoes are recommended. Those who wish to snorkel must be good swimmers, comfortable wearing the snorkeling equipment provided, being in deep water (depth can vary) and able to cope with occasional currents. Care should be taken not to touch or step on the coral reef for both safety and environmental reasons. Guests do have the option of remaining on the boat. Those participating in any water activities do so at their own risk and responsibility. Itinerary and stops may be reduced or may alternate dependent upon weather conditions. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed.

During your visit, you can relax and soak up the sun, or enjoy some great snorkeling and discover Moorea's amazing underwater world with its colorful fish, flora and fauna. There may even be some inquisitive stingrays to welcome you and in exchange for a piece of fish, they just might delight you by dancing gracefully around you.

Following a barbeque lunch on the beach that will include Tahitian raw fish, grilled fish and chicken, fresh cut fruits, soft drinks and beer, you will have more time to enjoy the refreshing waters here or further relax on the beach while being entertained with local music and a coco demonstration.

All too soon, it's time to re-board the boat and travel back to the cruise ship pier.

Please note: Walking and other activities are mainly at the guests' discretion; however, this tour is recommended for guests in reasonably good physical condition. It may be necessary to negotiate a ladder to board the boat from the water. The tour is not available to wheelchair guests or those with mobility concerns. Guests who wish to snorkel must be comfortable wearing the snorkeling equipment provided (mask & snorkel), being in deep water and able to cope with occasional currents. Fins are not provided, nor permitted, on the tour. Swimwear worn under a cover-up; sun cap; sunglasses; biodegradable sunscreen; towel; and flat comfortable shoes or aqua socks are recommended. Guests are cautioned not to touch or step on any coral for both safety and environmental reasons. Those participating in any water activities do so at their own risk and responsibility. As with all creatures in their natural environment, the presence of rays or other marine life is not guaranteed and tickets are non-refundable should a sighting not occur. Nuka Hiva's spectacular beauty and photo opportunities are yours to discover during this adventure in the Taipivai Valley. Your tour is conducted caravan style in groups of approximately 15 4WD vehicles with only one tour guide per group.

Drive to the Taipivai Valley, one of the richest archeological sites in the Marquesas Islands. The Taipivai Valley was made famous by the American writer and former sailor, Herman Melville (1819-1891), who deserted his ship and hid in this valley. Captured by the indigenous natives, he lived in the Taipivai Valley for three weeks, a period during which he observed their way of life. This experience was the inspiration for his novel, Typee. This landmark was most recently made famous by being the base camp for the Survivor TV show, filmed here in 2001.

Your drive leads you through valleys among lush vegetation and great view points. Along the way, you will pass small villages, churches and sacred temples, stopping to take in spectacular views and memorable photos of the coastline, bays and valleys. Itinerary and stops vary, depending on local conditions. You will also stop at the site of Te A'Aitua to enjoy a light refreshment and perhaps purchase a souvenir of your trip. Handicraft items are usually available at the site; however, please make sure to have small denominations of cash. Credit cards not accepted.

More spectacular views unfold on the return drive.

Please note: This tour is mainly panoramic with limited narration during photo stops only. Vehicles travel caravan style in groups of approximately 15, with only one tour guide for the entire group. While this tour includes limited walking, it does involve travel over paved roads and some uneven terrain. The tour is not available to wheelchair guests and is not recommended for those with mobility concerns, pregnant women or guests with back and/or neck problems. It is further recommended that families and friends wishing to ride together contact the Shore Excursions Desk in order to be assigned the same vehicle, which holds a maximum of 4 passengers. The drivers are not guides, and their command of the English language is very limited or none. Not all vehicles used are air-conditioned. Travelling to the Marquesas is discovering secluded islands, with limited facilities. Excursions are operated with local resident's personal vehicles - SUV double-cabin style, seating 4 pax (1 in front and 3 in the back) and are subject to availability.

Get acquainted with the coral gardens and tropical fish of Rangiroa during this scenic glass-bottom boat tour.

Depart the pier aboard a glass-bottom boat, then slowly float over the huge coral heads that cluster in shallow areas inside the Tiputa Channel. Along the way, you will see a colorful world of fish through the large windows. You may also encounter black-tipped sharks, and if lucky, catch a glimpse of the majestic Napoleon fish.

During the tour, your Polynesian boat crew will attract the fish directly under the glass panels to make it easy for you to observe and photograph them. A cover will provide protection from the sun and eliminate glare, enabling you to take home great pictures.

Following your tour, you will be transferred back to the pier.

Please note: This is not a snorkeling tour. The tour includes limited walking; however it is not suitable for wheelchair guests. Lightweight clothing; sun cap; sunglasses; sunscreen; and flat, comfortable walking shoes are recommended. While marine life is widely present in this region; sightings cannot be guaranteed. Although the guides used are the best available, they are not certified and they may have limited English speaking skills.

RGI-003 DISCOVER THE WORLD OF PEARLS

"Explore Rangiroa's black pearl industry, learn about pearl cultivation and shop for unset black pearls during this memorable visit to a black pearl farm.

Depart the pier for the drive along Rangiroa's main road, past the airport and on to the black pearl farm. Most pearl farms are small-sized, and the number of workers at this farm is quite representative of the farms in this region.

Upon arrival at the farm, the staff will give you a brief lecture about the farming and production of black pearls. You will learn about the chronology and evolution of the industry, and how oysters are selected, grown and then grafted for production. Following the lecture, you will proceed to the work sheds where oysters are sorted and cleaned, and watch a grafter at work as he skillfully plies his trade.

The highlight of the excursion will be an opportunity to view a selection of unset black pearls that are available for purchase. Here, your guide will show you the criteria for grading pearls in terms of quality. The shape and luster are very important. You will see the round, baroque and semi-baroque pearls ranging in grades from C to A.

Following your visit, you will re-board your mini-van for the return drive to the pier.

Please note: Walking on this tour is mainly at guests' discretion. As vehicles don't have a storage area, tour is not recommended to wheelchair guests. The short transfer to the pearl farm is not guided; it is operated by minibus/van and some jump seats may be used. This tour is for guests who are interested in learning about pearl cultivation, or for those shopping for unset black pearls. The prices are fixed; cash, Visa or MasterCard are accepted. The Tuamotus are very remote islands and although the guides used are the best available, they are not certified and have limited English skills.

Depart the pier via local boat for the ride to Motu Nui Nui, a natural, open-water aquarium renowned for its marine life. Upon arrival, you will receive your safety instructions, then enter the water to explore your surroundings. Along the way, you will observe an abundance of colorful fish, coral and marine life. Your guide will offer assistance in the water, and throughout the tour. During the tour, you will also have an opportunity to hand-feed the fish. Following your snorkeling session, you will be transferred back to the pier.

Please note: Participants must be in good physical condition, be good swimmers and fit to negotiate steps and vessel surroundings. Guests must be comfortable wearing the snorkeling equipment provided (mask and snorkel), being in deep water and able to cope with occasional currents. Fins are not provided. Swimwear worn under a cover-up, sun protection, biodegradable sunscreen, a towel and flat comfortable shoes or aquasocks are recommended. Guests are cautioned not to touch or step on any coral for both safety and environmental reasons. Those participating in any water activities do so at their own risk and responsibility. Wildlife sightings are likely but never guaranteed. The tour is not available to wheelchair guests or those with mobility concerns. Although the guides used are the best available, they may have limited English skills; thus, narration will be very sparse or even non-existent.

Guests who wish to snorkel must be comfortable wearing the snorkeling equipment provided (mask & snorkel), being in deep water, and be good swimmers that are able to cope with occasional currents. Fins are not provided. Swimwear worn under a cover-up; sun cap; sunglasses; biodegradable sunscreen; towel; and flat comfortable shoes or aqua socks are recommended. After departing from the pier, you will soon begin cruising the lagoon that surrounds Bora Bora, an island of almost mythical beauty. Settle in wherever you please, as the catamaran features trampolines for sunbathing, and shaded seating if you prefer a covered environment.

Because the catamaran has a shallow draft, it can cruise into areas off limits to other vessels, presenting you with spectacular, up-close views of the lagoon's coves and Bora Bora's iconic overwater bungalows. You can expect the shoreline to be jungle-like with plenty of coconut palms swaying in the sea breezes. From this perspective, you will also enjoy an excellent view of Mount Otemanu, one of two extinct volcanoes rising from the center of the island.

In time, you will stop to swim and snorkel (mask & snorkel provided) along a coral reef teeming with brightly colored tropical fish. Although the sights are ever changing, you can expect to see many of the most common species such as clown fish, yellow Moorish idols and emperor angelfish.

If you spot a blue parrotfish nipping at the algae clinging to the reef, it's a male, as female parrotfish sport different colors. You might also spot graceful eagle rays, spinner and bottlenose dolphins, and perhaps a green turtle, a species ancient Polynesians held sacred.

Please note: This tour includes limited walking. When famed 18th-century explorer Captain James Cook first saw Bora Bora, he coined it the "Pearl of the Pacific," and the island is still visually stunning, especially from the unique perspective of an ATV.

As you race along the natural trails and off road, you will follow the idyllic coastline at times and travel inland, as well. Because Bora Bora was volcanically formed, there aren't indigenous mammals, but birds are abundant.

Lush vegetation and shades of blue are part of the tour, as the viewpoints will allow some amazing photo opportunities of the Pearl of the Pacific!

Please note: Cost of this tour is per vehicle, not per person, and only one guest per couple needs to book it. Drivers must be 18 years of age or older and have a valid driver's license (presented to the guide before tour departure); passengers must be 8 years of age or older.

At a set time, your boat will be back to pick you up and take you back to your ship.
